
Welcome news for our parishes



Father Tony goes full circle

Father Tony moved away to serve elsewhere in our diocese – now he's been appointed as priest-in-charge of his home parish. Bishop Jonathan has appointed Father Tony Forrest to serve as interim priest-in-charge of the Upper Meon parishes, which includes his home in East Meon. Tony's previous ordained role was further south along the River Meon, in the Bridge benefice.

It marks a new era of collaboration for the four parishes of East Meon, Langrish, West Meon and Warnford. This will bring a new dimension to the churches working together that has already been pursued over the last two years.

Tony said: "Having returned to live in this area, I have been helping out in these parishes and have felt energised by it. I had a sense of calling to this role, and have felt welcomed back to this community. It does feel right to serve here. It is different being a vicar in a village, such as this, rather than being a member of the community but there is much that is familiar and I think it will be very rewarding."

Tony originally worked as a chemistry teacher, head teacher and university lecturer before he was ordained as a deacon in 2011 and a priest in 2012. He was a curate in North End Team Ministry and a chaplain at Portsmouth College. He also served as the Chair of the Board of Education.

He then moved to become rector in the Meon Bridge benefice, which includes the parishes of Droxford, Exton and Meonstoke with Corhampton. He was there from 2015 until last year when he returned to his East Meon home.

He will spend seventy per cent of his time in his new role – as interim priest-in-charge of the parishes of East Meon, Langrish, West Meon and Warnford – in line with the Petersfield deanery plan. He has plans to spend much of the rest of his time exploring journeys in the Bible.

"When I started at the Bridge benefice, the parishes had already been working together, and one of the things I realised is that there were some events and activities they could do together and others that were specific to each village," he said, "so Remembrance and Harvest might be slightly different in each place. The parishes in the Upper Meon have been working together, but we probably need to work out which things we want to do together and which are distinct."

"As I'm a teacher, one of the things I'm also keen on is not just that people learn, but that they train to teach others as well. So if we're doing a Lent Course, it's not all about me leading it but usually about helping lay people to have the confidence and ability to lead sessions."

"I've been trying to learn Welsh and also to look at a project exploring Biblical journeys. I've been working through fifty journeys in the Bible, from the Old Testament right through to Paul's missionary journeys. I'd like to put together an Ignatian resource that will help people to revisit those journeys using imaginative prayer. I hope it will help their journeys through life."

Tony will be licensed to his new role in All Saints Church, East Meon, on 23rd January.

Mr Chester, Mr Woods and the Warnford Church Dispute

The Warnford Park estate has a long history of opening it's gates for Snowdrop Sundays as the newspaper clipping from an unknown source shows (perhaps dating to the 1970s).



Today it is Andrew and Candi Sellick who have granted permission but, of course, there have been different owners over the generations. For sixty years it was the Chester family and Rex Chester has collected an interesting archive of articles and recollections that is available online at https://www.warnford.info/. As he says, "The blog is built around the archive of material collected by my father and myself to record our experience as stewards of this special place and members of the village community. It covers a range of topics including the pre-war pigfarming operation, recollections of Warnford during the war, sailing on the lake in Warnford Park, creating the Memorial Playground, saving the village Post Office and all manner of other happenings and events related to sixty wonderful years in the Meon Valley."

One of the articles is titled: Warnford Park: black sheep, snowdrops & Mr. Woods explains! It brings together the newspaper clip shown above, a photograph of a small flock of black sheep which were grazing the park in the Seventies, the Hambledon Country Fair (when it was held at Warnford) and an article entitled the Warnford Church Dispute published in the Portsmouth Evening News in 1935. Charles Woods owned the estate before the Chesters and he had a different perspective on whether the public should be allowed access. Mr. Woods put up notices to reinforce the fact that there was no legal right of access to the church and that parishioners (only) were entitled to access the church. All other visitors needed to seek consent by calling at North Lodge and promising to behave responsibly. Prior to the arrival of the Vicar Canon Sedgewick in fact the Church had been locked. The notices caused ill feeling locally as

people felt that it was an immemorial right to use the Church and took that right for granted. In fact there wasn't really much of a dispute although some of the boards were vandalised. Mr Woods had his actions approved by the Bishop of Portsmouth (Dr. E Neville Lovett CBE) and had never sought to stop the villagers from attending church. He simply wanted to stop the public using the Estate as a public park, and to prevent damage, but it all goes to show that the disputes in the press then were no different from the kind of thing we see on social media today. The piece ends with a glimpse of how grand the house and estate were before the main house was demolished after the war.

Dr Kelly is an ecologist who specialises in protected species. She is a passionate naturalist with particular interest in the conservation of native reptiles. She will give her ecologist's view of the current state of the natural world and whether we can save it.

This sounds like a fascinating and topical subject and we look forward to seeing you there.

Winter sleepers - the hibernating habits of hedgehogs, bats and hazel dormice.

As the temperature drops for winter you may have observed a change in local wildlife as species adapt to cope with the colder weather. Some species will avoid the unfavourable conditions through migration and others grow thicker winter coats, but a handful of Britain's wildlife will tough out the cold weather through hibernation.

Hibernation is a process of a prolonged period of inactivity that allows animals to survive when food is scarce and the weather is harsh. To prepare for hibernation animals will build up



a reserve of body fat by eating as much as possible in the lead up to winter, before retreating to somewhere safe where they will enter a torpid state. Once settled, almost all of the animal's bodily functions will either completely stop or slow down significantly, the body temperature will cool, and breathing and heart rate will slow down. For example, a bat's heartrate will slow to an astonishing four beats per minute but can reach 1000 bpm when flying. This reduces the amount of energy its body must burn to survive.

There are only three UK mammals that truly hibernate: bats, Hazel dormice and European hedgehogs.

Dormice and hedgehogs hibernate right through the winter by developing enough brown body fat (fat reserves they can utilize during prolonged periods of sleep), which they build up by eating fat and sugar-rich foods. In some cases, they can increase their own body weight by over 30%.

As omnivores (an animal which eats both plants and animals) hedgehogs are not picky eaters. These iconic creatures will feast on anything from fruit and insects to beetles and frogs,

and will reach a weight of 500-700 grams. Hedgehogs are also not fussy when deciding where they will overwinter. Some will build their own nest from dead leaves and twigs, whilst others will happily take shelter under a pile of logs, your compost heap or under a garden shed. Be careful when moving piles of leaves or wood over the winter as there may be a hibernating hedgehog underneath.

In the woodlands, dormice will gorge on a menu of nuts, seeds and berries, building up vital energy reserves. Dormice construct insulated nests hidden in hedgerows and thickets, where they retreat for hibernation.

During autumn, bats are especially active in hunting and finding a place to overwinter. Bats are unable to dig or build their shelters so have to look for the right spot. They like to roost in veteran trees that are hollow as well as man-made structures. You might find them wedged into holes in an old brick wall or in the roof of your house, but old barns and abandoned buildings are also favoured spots.

Rainfall report for November/December

The second half of November certainly improved and we managed to only have rain on 7 days as opposed to 13 in the first half of the month. November ended with 151.6mms (5.96"). However heavy rain resumed after a 1 day respite on 1st December and then it rained on every day there after up until the 14th.

We haven't really had any serious frosts yet with only 3 nights when the temperature dropped below zero. In the first 14 days of December we have measured 97mm (3.82"). This is on course to be the 3rd wettest year since 1974 when I started to record. 2000 and 2014 were wetter with almost identical rainfalls of about 1360mm, as a comparison the driest year was 1989 with 772mm (30.4") while the total for this year is now 1212mm (47.72").

Just to let you know that our recordings are accurate as we have just had our 3 year visit from the Met Office to check our rain gauge and they were happy with it.







Friday 8th March...Past Lives


Nora and Hae Sung, childhood best friends are separated when Nora's family emigrate from South Korea to Canada – twenty years later they are reunited for one fateful week.
