## A stranger's help

Jesus famously read from a scroll of the Prophet Isaiah in the synagogue and the people were astonished by what he said about it – sadly, we don't have his sermon, so we have to work out for ourselves what he might have wanted us to do. The text he read, and spoke about, included the following:

“The Lord has sent me to bring good news to the oppressed,  
to bind up the broken-hearted,  
to proclaim liberty to the captives,  
and release to the prisoners;  
to comfort all who mourn,  
to provide the oil of gladness instead of sadness,  
the mantle of praise instead of a faint spirit.  
Strangers shall stand and feed your flocks,  
the peoples shall till your land and dress your vines.”

These words based on Isaiah 61 remind all people of good heart, and certainly all Christians, that we are called to care one another, and, just as importantly, to accept the help of others. The richness of the original text reminds us of God's concern for those who are broken-hearted and those who mourn. God's concern is also for people in captivity, those literally imprisoned, those without the means to get and about, and those shut-in because of conditions of the

mind, body or spirit. 'Captive' to a degenerative illness, 'broken-hearted' or 'mourning' might describe someone very near-by and any number of others across our communities in need of our kindness. Perhaps, we are one of the ones who needs some compassion or companionship.

The passage proclaims the good news of liberty, gladness, and hope for an ancient people in captivity, but it is good news for us too in our times that are certainly not without their worries.

In this real and broken world, we can often see both the challenges and the good news side by side. The sadness on the faces of those who have lost all belongings in the fires around Los Angeles and the miraculous rescue of an elderly grandmother in a wheelchair. The tragedies can sometimes be spontaneous and not entirely anyone's fault – a wildfire, an earthquake or a debilitating illness. But the good news events, the modern miracles, are almost invariably the result of someone's selfless courage, or kindness or just their willingness to act.

Christians, like those of many faiths, are called to love our neighbours. The Good Samaritan, a stranger and not a neighbour in the usual sense, did not walk by, neither did he just offer a kind smile and a cheery wave. He acted when faced by another human being who was suffering - he offered practical and life-saving help.

So THANK YOU to all those who sent in toys or money for families in need in Portsmouth – you made a real and precious difference, and thank you too for all those who made sure people alone at Christmas got a meal or had some human contact, thank you to all those who shop for others or just make the effort to chat. Thank you all for your commitment to friend and stranger alike.

We look to Jesus for the example, strength, and courage that it takes to be collaborative, generous, and resourceful. We shall pray that the arrival of spring will be accompanied by new joy and lasting hope.

Please be assured of our prayers for our whole community, and along with so many people of good spirit and conscience, we shall also do all we can to support the whole community. To those

who feel most vulnerable, please know that you are not forgotten and do let us know if we can help you in any way.

There will doubtlessly be further challenges ahead, but let's look to one another in a spirit of community solidarity and cooperation, whatever our faith. Let us try to share the load in making sure that no one is left feeling alone and broken-hearted. Fewer of us may have neighbours with flocks to feed, land to till or vines to dress than once was the case, but we can all share 'the oil of gladness' and do what we can to reduce any sadness that may be around us.

## Snowdrop events at Warnford Church - open on Saturdays in 2025

The organisers have decided that the Warnford Snowdrop events, held on Sundays in February for more than 50 years in aid of Warnford church, will be closed in 2025. There will however be a limited ticketed event open on Saturdays.

For more than 50 years a wonderful team of local volunteers have welcomed visitors to enjoy the remarkable display of Snowdrops in the woodlands around the church. Throughout this time it has been possible to park all the visitors' cars on the site – however in 2023 and 2024 the event appeared widely on social media and the number of visitors brought the traffic on the A32 to a standstill and blocked the local lanes with parked cars.

The Snowdrop Sunday events have never been advertised in the past however the advent of social media and visitors sharing information about their experience has created a level of interest that the current on-site parking arrangements cannot accommodate. The organisers have taken advice and have decided that the safest course of action to avoid the traffic problems that they have experienced is to close the Sunday events for one year.

Closing the Sunday events in 2025 will be disappointing news to everyone who has visited and supported the church in the past however there will be a limited opportunity to enjoy the Snowdrop display on Saturday afternoons in February using a ticketed system

with timed entry times. Details of how to purchase tickets for the Saturday opening will be available in due course on the Warnford Snowdrops website [www.warnfordsnowdrops.org.uk](http://www.warnfordsnowdrops.org.uk) - we would be grateful if you could share this information with your friends and family who have visited to see the Snowdrops in the past.

## West Meon CE Primary School

The cold snap at the start of our Spring term meant children were wrapped in coats, hats and gloves when they undertook their outdoor learning and at playtimes. The short snowfall in our first week was very much enjoyed by the children as it gave them additional time away from the classroom. Our lunch time break gives children the opportunity to explore both physical and role playing activities in our secure space. This term we have invested in additional equipment to enable us to provide an 'Active Playtime'. With the help of trained 'play leaders' we set out construction, balance board and obstacle course activities on a rotational basis, always including some mindfulness drawing and colouring in our calm area for those students who like to be creative on paper. We are currently looking into how we can include a Den building activity.



As you read this we will be heading towards our half term break and World Book Day which takes place on Thursday 6th March. As a school, we will be organising a Book Week where we focus on reading and literature in the various forms it now presents itself. Although World Book Day traditionally falls on a Thursday, we will be dressing up on the Friday, so keep your eyes peeled for some unusual costumes around West Meon!

Last term, children at West Meon took part in performances and challenges which contributed to the building of confidence, self-belief and supports the development of resilience. With those tools, the children are now ready to be challenged and stretched. Year 6 have begun to look at the outcomes they need to achieve for their end of year assessment. Alongside new topics for the term, Owls class will be venturing out to the swimming pool for one of their PE sessions.

Since 1994, swimming and water safety has been a statutory element of the national curriculum for physical education in England. This means that every 11-year old child should leave primary school with the skills to keep themselves safe while enjoying swimming with friends and family. Swimming is the only sport to be included within the national curriculum physical education programme of study. All primary schools must provide swimming and water safety lessons in either Key Stage 1 or 2. Since 2012 Swim England has monitored the provision of curriculum swimming and water safety in primary schools, and research has consistently shown that only half of pupils meet the required standards. There are many reasons why primary schools struggle to deliver swimming and water safety lessons. These include cost, time out of lessons, lack of confidence and a lack of understanding of the outcomes. At West Meon we are lucky enough to have access to Bedales' pool and some very experienced swimming teachers

to enable us to meet National expectations.

Friends of West Meon School (FOWMS) have been thinking about ways to raise money to support the school so keep a look out for events coming up in the next month or so; their aim is to include the local community when possible. Our school council raised £45 for Save the Children with their Christmas Jumper day in December and will be looking to arrange some school events to save up for a new Buddy Bench for our playground.

As you read this, we will be hoping to have arranged a visit to Warnford to view the snowdrops – what a great start to Spring!

## The Meon Valley Bus

The Meon Valley Community Bus Association is a registered charity that has been providing transport facilities in the villages of the Meon Valley where no public transport service is available since 1985. All our drivers are unpaid volunteers and certified by the Community Transport Association under the Minibus Driver Awareness Scheme and we are delighted to announce the arrival of our brand-new community bus.



We operate a scheduled weekday service on Mondays to Fareham, on Wednesdays to Petersfield, and on Fridays in rotation to Winchester, Fareham, Hedge End or Waterlooville and our timetable is often published in the parish magazine (see rear). The bus stops in West Meon outside the Thomas Lord pub and at Warnford Village Hall (or George

and Falcon on Wednesdays) on our outbound journeys. On the return our drivers will usually try to stop as close as possible to where you live and will often help you with any heavy shopping.

In addition to our scheduled service, the bus is also available for private hire. For example, we work with the Active Retirement Association to arrange theatre trips; with gardening associations providing transport to gardens of interest, and with providing transport for school outings.

We aspire to deliver a better - and certainly more friendly and helpful - service than many commercial bus companies. We are always pleased to welcome new passengers, who we hope will enjoy meeting the happy community of users and become regular users themselves. ## Rainfall report for December 2024 to mid-January 2025

December rainfall ended with 61.4mm (2.42") giving a total for the year of 1090.7mms (42.9"). This compares with 1249.9mms (49.2") in 2023. The wettest months being February with 182.7mms (7.2") and September with 135.4mms (5.3").

2025 has started with quite a lot of rain in the first eight days (75.9mms) 2.9" and then a cold spell set in with some very low temperatures down to -7C on the 10th and 11th but nevertheless sunny, bright days when some brisk walking was required to keep warm or if you preferred, sitting in front of a fire and reading the paper!



## Romance comes to West Meon Community Cinema


As our February film night happens to fall on Friday 14th which is Valentine's Day we decided that a good old 'rom-com' would be an appropriate choice.

## Silent hunters

The barn owl, with its ghostly white feathers and heart-shaped face, is one of the most iconic birds of prey in the UK. Known for its silent flight and stealthy hunting techniques, this magnificent bird is a true countryside symbol. Its haunting appearance has earned it the old country name 'hushwing,' which aptly describes its ability to glide noiselessly through the night in search of prey.

A remarkable combination of features allows the barn owl to be such an effective hunter.

The trailing edges of its wings are lined with soft, serrated feathers that reduce noise, enabling the bird to fly almost silently. Barn owls also have excellent night vision, perfectly adapted for hunting in low light. Their long legs, talons, and highly sensitive ears, aided by their distinctive facial discs, help them locate prey even in tall grass or underbrush. The facial discs act as a sound funnel, directing noises into the owl's keen ears, allowing it to detect even the slightest movement on the ground below.

In Hampshire, barn owls are an increasingly familiar sight, especially in the winter months when they extend their hunting hours to find enough food to survive the colder conditions. This time of year can be an excellent opportunity to spot these silent hunters as they venture out during daylight hours to hunt for voles, mice, and other small mammals. The best times to see them are at dawn or dusk, when their hunting is most active.

Several nature reserves managed by Hampshire & Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust offer great opportunities to observe barn owls in their natural habitat. Hockley Meadows Nature Reserve in Winchester is a known hotspot for these beautiful birds, where visitors can watch them glide over the meadows and hunt in the early morning or late afternoon. On the Isle of Wight, Arreton Down is another fantastic location, offering a mix of farmland and open grassland that provides their perfect environment. Meanwhile, Farlington Marshes Nature Reserve near Portsmouth is a must-visit for birdwatchers, with the reserve attracting not only barn owls but also short-eared owls, making it a great destination for raptor enthusiasts.

While watching barn owls, it's important to be respectful of their environment. Always maintain a safe distance, avoid disturbing wildlife, and keep dogs on leads. 

## West Meon Parish Council

**West Meon Parish Council (WMPC) communication** – all official communication from WMPC is through the website [www.westmeon-pc.gov.uk](http://www.westmeon-pc.gov.uk), the village notice board in the high street and the Parish News. **Winchester County Council notice of election** – WCC issued the notice of election of West Meon Parish Councillors on the 8th of January. This has been displayed on our notice board since this date as per the directive of WCC. At the time of writing this, we do not know if it will be contested. WMPC are only permitted to distribute election information and documentation issued by WCC, this notice of election is the first official communication we have permission to publish.

**Salt Bins** – These are the responsibility of Hampshire County Council. You can report any issues or re-fill requests on their website: [www.hants.gov.uk/report](http://www.hants.gov.uk/report)

**Traffic Surveys** – These have been received by the Chairman and are being reviewed.

**Unitary Authority** - The English Devolution White Paper that was published on 16th December 2024 and sets out the Government's intention to drive a programme of devolution and local government reorganisation across England. For our area, this could mean:

- A plan to replace our current two local authorities (Winchester City Council and Hampshire County Council) with a single-tier Unitary Authority.
- A plan to create a new level of Local Government called a Strategic Authority, that covers several Unitary Authorities and is led by an elected mayor.
- Our Strategic Authority will likely cover the whole of Hampshire, plus Southampton, Portsmouth and the Isle of Wight.
- Upper Tier Councils, including Hampshire have put forward proposals by 10th January 2025, seeking to be a potential pilot authority, for inclusion in the Devolution Priority Programme, with wide ranging reorganisation plans to be submitted in the Autumn of 2025.
