



Cyber Bobby – Our First Year

The growing demands of the digital age come with pitfalls. Cybercrime and fraud can have a devastating impact, both financially and emotionally, on victims' lives. In January 2022 The Blue Lamp Trust launched the Cyber Bobby scheme to help older people, those with disabilities or who have been a victim of cyber crime to stay safe online.

The Cyber Bobby service is unique in offering home visits from our volunteer Cyber Advisors to give advice and guidance about basic IT security and how to avoid being affected by a cyber crime or a cyber enabled crime to the elderly and disabled in Hampshire.

The areas covered during a visit are:

- What is cyber crime?
- Cyber and scam prevention advice
- How to check privacy settings
- Signposting to other advice and resources
- How to report issues
- How to recognise scam emails and text messages



In the first year of the scheme we have visited 76 residents in Hampshire. 88% of these have been aged 60 and over. 23% of referrals were for people who had already been a victim of cyber crime. Collectively our volunteer Cyber Advisors have donated over 135 hours of their time, visiting residents and giving talks to community groups. One clients feedback; "It was wonderful, I learnt lots. It is a great service and I appreciated the advisors being so patient with me".

Supported by the emergency services and local authorities, The Blue Lamp Trust offers two schemes; Bobby Scheme & Cyber Bobby Scheme. Both provide free services to elderly and vulnerable people in Hampshire (the Bobby Scheme also covers Isle of Wight). The Bobby scheme promotes crime prevention and fire safety initiatives. For over 20 years its trained fitters, who are all vetted by Hampshire police, uniformed and carry ID cards, visit homes to fill out home crime-prevention surveys, give reassurance and offer specific crime-prevention advice to improve safety. They also fit locks, spyholes, door chains and smoke alarms where needed.

A Short History of the West Meon Village Shop

When I came to the village in 1973, there were three general stores in the village, plus a saddler, a butcher, two pubs, and the post office. What is our house now on The Cross used to be Parson's Empire Stores and it folded just before I bought it. Sim and Nina Byles ran Byles shop on the north side of the High Street and our village shop then was called Valley Stores. Alan Banham's shop – The Saddlery and DIY Shop sold hardware and nails by the pound – closed some 20 years ago and the property is now owned by Karen Hughes. The Valley Stores had a series of tenants with varying degrees of success until Sim sold out The Baechus and moved across the street to take over Valley Stores. In due course Sim and Nina retired after serving the village for many, many years and the shop found new owners again until forced to

close along with all the others except the butchers.

Seeing the need for a village shop four residents of West Meon clubbed together to fund buying the lease from the last owner and refurbishing the building in its entirety. The plan covered rewiring, new display equipment and racks, a new floor, redecoration throughout including



the flat above, a café and operating capital. The money raised was given as a non-repayable loan and is on the books as such. The shop is constituted as an Industrial Provident Society and shares were sold in the company to residents of the village. That was all back in 2006 and the shop reopened for business later that year. The shop was manned by a paid manager, paid delivery drivers, some paid till staff and volunteers. The two delivery rounds for papers and milk were kept and the café opened for business as well. Letting the flat has had its moments, that and the café contribute very usefully to the rent we pay for the whole establishment. There was and is a management committee the members of which are the early contributors or founders and others brought in to help with their specific knowledge, not least the accounts, legal obligations and the desperate modern needs of the computer systems. From the start a computerised management system was bought and installed giving us the automated till, bar code readers and customer accounts processing.

Over the years, we have had our ups and downs. The lead was stolen off the flat roof twice, and there have been two other burglaries. Our milk and paper round was halted by an accident with an SUV that was driven without due care and attention. The drains, ah, the drains! We have a full repairing lease. In 2013 the West Meon Hut garage opened in competition with their own general store.

The competition from the garage cut our turnover and our ability to dictate margins and as a result in 2014 the shop lost £40,000. The management committee called a special "town hall" meeting to discuss options and to raise awareness in the village and the valley. Volunteers from the village formed a group to address the issues and plot a recovery. The group met regularly and identified several areas in need of study and help:

The trading margins were insupportable;

- The delivery rounds were losing money hand over fist;
- The electricity bill was horrendous;
- The automation of the purchasing process (to some extent).

By 2015 the loss was reduced to £20,000 and by 2016 the shop broke even and continued to do so until habits changed for the better with Covid. The losses were born through the generosity of one of our benefactors and for the most part is still outstanding. In 2016 a team from the village completely rearranged the inside of the shop with the till moving from the door to where it is now. Replacing the old Formica and aluminium extruded section with an oak working surface for the till and introducing new display crates has worked wonders with the general ambiance, resulting in visitors remarking how welcoming the shop is and how they wished they had one like it.

So to bring us up to date: we have signed a new 15 years lease for the shop, café and the flat above, with rents agreed for the first five years. After that we will be subject to a market rate rent review. We have replaced and upgraded the computer systems and had the sewer lined and cut the electricity consumption to half of what it was. This was done by buying more efficient chillers and changing all the lighting to LED. We still maintain the inner delivery round but were unable to find a driver for the outer round which has had to be abandoned.

The West Meon Wine Society initiative has helped the finances enormously and that money is used for projects and not for the normal run of the business.

Now for the future: the minimum wage continues to increase year by year and the big unknown is the cost of power. During Covid lockdowns shopping habits changed to our advantage with an increase in turnover around 25% but we are now drifting back to the situation prior to the pandemic. The subject of marketing, dragging customers in from the street, has been raised many times but only Covid had a noticeable effect despite our best efforts at promotion through leaflets, pamphlets and the like.

Our support from the village, the city council and the parish council is vital and hugely appreciated. Every now and then we receive totally unexpected and unlooked for donations from private individuals which we use to help with maintenance and replacement of equipment. By June of 2024, we are obligated to our landlord for the redecoration and maintenance both internally and externally. Some we will contract out but help from volunteers will be needed to set off the effects of the new austerity, but we are not calling it that!

The shop is part of our village history brought about by our community with all its many strengths and now with a lease in place for the next 15 years. Your ongoing help and support is essential for all of us.

Early bloomers hint at Spring

As the light creeps slowly back into our evening skies, the very first spring flowers brave the frosty ground, providing the earliest of hints that sunnier days lie ahead. Perhaps the first floral sign that spring is edging ever closer is the appearance of the humble snowdrop. This elegant little plant may be seen peeping over the frosted soil of woodlands, churchyards or gardens as early as January and can continue to flower until March.

Their dainty (yet deceptively hardy) nodding, pure white flowers have often symbolised innocence, purity and hope. In fact, in Yorkshire, it was customary for village maidens to gather bunches of snowdrops and wear them as a symbol of their purity on February 2nd, which was Candlemas – or otherwise, the feast of the Virgin Mary. Despite its long history in the UK, however, the snowdrop may not actually be native to our shores; they were not recorded as growing wild here until the late 18th century. Nevertheless, it has certainly become naturalised from garden escapees, and white snowdrop 'valleys' can now be seen across the country.

Another delightful flower that you may find on a late winter walk is the primrose. The name 'primrose' comes from the Latin 'prima rosa', meaning 'first rose'. This is very apt, as this resilient little plant can flower as early as December in mild years. Look out for their pretty, creamy-yellow flowers in woodland and grassland habitats.

Primroses are also one of the main foodplants for the caterpillars of the threatened and extremely rare Duke of Burgundy butterfly, which is only found in England. Since Victorian times, April 19th has been known as 'Primrose Day' in honour of the late Prime Minister Benjamin Disraeli. Primroses were his favourite flowers and they duly grow near his statue in

Westminster Abbey and by his grave at Hughenden in Buckinghamshire.

Lesser celandines also bring a welcome splash of sunshine in early spring. Keep an eye out for their bright and buttery blooms growing along hedgerows, in parks and even in graveyards from March through to May. Their happy, star-shaped yellow flowers typically open in the sunlight. As one of the first spring flowers to bloom, the low-growing lesser celandines provide a valuable nectar source for early insects. Despite its name, lesser celandine is not a close relative of greater celandine – it is actually a member of the buttercup family.

Rainfall report for January/February

The rain finally stopped on the 15th January after our last report and we then had a dry spell until the 25th when we had 1.5mms, the month ending with 139.5mms (5.49"). 'February fill dyke' as it was once called, has been amazingly dry with the only rain recorded was on the 2nd with 0.7mms since then it has been very dry and apart from the 5th to the 10th not particularly cold either. The lowest temperature we recorded was -7C on the 7th of the month. Our first two Warnford Snowdrop Sundays have been dry underfoot and we have had record crowds.



Over the Garden Wall

A selection of plant studies, drawings and paintings, by renowned landscape artist W H Allen from the collection in the care of Hampshire Cultural Trust. Allen (1863–1943) is best known for his evocative watercolours and chalk and pencil sketches of the landscapes, traditions and people of West Surrey and North-east Hampshire.

As with most professional artists his sketchbook was never far from his side. For a landscape artist, developing the skill instantly to capture changes in the natural world, from season to season, often minute to minute, was essential. These studies allowed Allen to create a body of work that he could reference, and seek inspiration from, when developing the landscape paintings he is most famous for.

While these studies aren't intended to be detailed botanical illustrations, they do successfully convey the character and appearance of plants you may well have glimpsed over a garden wall, as you strolled the quiet country lanes of Hampshire in the early 1900s. 4th March to 23rd April, FREE.

West Meon Wine Society Chairman's Report

The West Meon Wine Society was established as an independently run division of the West Meon Village Shop in May 2020. Its purpose is to help our members discover new and interesting wines, have fun with a growing network of their friends and neighbours, and raise more revenue to help support and secure our much loved village shop. The Society is being managed by the following team of local residents: Jerry Berry, Louise Court, Peter and Sue Fowler, Bernice Gibson-Ost, Nigel Haigh, Mark Hammond, Richard Middleton, John and Sue Scholes, and Graham Walker.

As at 31st December 2022 the Society had over 60 members. The principal benefits of membership are priority access to our tastings, discounted rates for two people to each of our tastings (subject to ticket availability), and access to, help with and support for, wine-oriented events that members wish to hold with their friends and neighbours.

We currently have a wine portfolio of over 100 different wines listed on our website www. westmeonwine.co.uk. All of these wines have been tasted and selected by the Management Team members, at their own personal expense, from a range of more than twice that number. Wines are listed on our website only if they have been approved for enjoyment and affordability by a significant majority of the Team. We intend this approach to give our members and customers confidence that they will appreciate wines purchased from the Society.

During 2023, we aim to offer five new selections of wines. The first will be focused on New Zealand wines, to be released shortly. Details of other future additions to the online portfolio will be circulated to all Members as our plans evolve.

It has always been a central aim of The Society that we should host or facilitate get-togethers of members during the year to taste the Society's wines and enjoy the company and friendship of old and new friends from the village and its neighbouring communities. Our preliminary plans for 2023 tasting events are as follows:

- Friday 24th March (pre-dinner) A tutored tasting event comparing New Zealand wines with similar wines from other countries
- Monday 8th May (after lunch) A celebratory tasting to acknowledge the coronation of King Charles III.
 - July A summer wines tutored tasting at a local vineyard
 - October A specialist wine importer-tutored tasting in the village
 - Friday 24th November A Christmas treats social in or near the village

In the period since the inception of the Society to 31st December 2022, we have generated £38,400 of wine sales, £4,600 of events sales and an allocation of some £1,200 of membership subscriptions. Our activities have allowed us to make a direct contribution to the bottom line of our village shop of

£4,300, being 10.0% of total sales.

Subscription renewals are due on 31st March 2023. Members will shortly receive an invoice requesting payment. The subscription has been kept at £30 providing members with membership benefits for another year (including discounts on ticket prices for members and a plus one to each of our events).

West Meon Village Hall

The hall is a great place to hire for regular classes, clubs or groups and for parties, especially following the repainting inside which was undertaken during last Autumn. Come and have a look if you haven't been in for a while!

However although our income in 2022 was back to (and exceeded) pre-covid levels, the rocketing cost of electricity which we all know about and unexpected maintenance costs including repairing part of the roof meant that we made an operating loss of over £5,500. Our initial budgets for this year indicated an even bigger gap was likely to occur in 2023.

So at our January meeting we took some difficult decisions to try to get back to break-even namely:

- a) we have halved our professional cleaning time to once per week, and
- b) we have increased our hiring fees by around 17.5%. This means that the hourly rates for Parish Bookings are now £13 for the Main Hall and £9 for the Small Hall. We're sorry for the impact that both of these measures will have on our hirers, but needed to ensure that we are stable enough financially to keep the hall running for the longer term.

We have further plans to reduce our running costs and are trying hard to increase bookings. We have some exciting plans – details to follow in the coming months.
