Not so Ordinary Time!

Last month, I wrote about Ordinary Time, the Church's green season, which got underway again at the beginning of June and continues well into Autumn. In Ordinary Time, we do not celebrate one specific aspect of the life and ministry of Jesus, as we do at Eastertide for example. Rather, and especially on the Sundays, we reflect on a wide range of aspects of Jesus' teaching.

Sunday, in a sense, is our original feast day. It is in some ways a weekly Easter. Christians have gathered every Sunday - the day of Christ's resurrection, the first day of the week - ever since there were Christians. When we gather on Sundays in Ordinary Time, as always, we hear the scriptures proclaimed. The church reads straight through 'the gospel of the year,' this year it is Mark, and next year it will be Luke, followed by Matthew, and back to Mark. (We generally read John during Lent and Easter, and on some special festivals.) Readings tend to be continuous week-by-week, often resuming where we left off the week before. The other readings have been chosen for their relationship to the gospel passages. Many voices are heard throughout summer. Much of the ministry and teaching of Jesus and the mystery of Christ, in all their aspects, unfold so we can reflect on how we should grow.

What is the heart of our Sunday celebration? We celebrate the eucharist; that is, we do our thanksgiving. We praise and thank God for all creation; we pray for the whole world, as we remember Christ's life, death and resurrection.

We, importantly, share bread and wine. Along the way, the priest often prays with these words:

*'Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation:
through your goodness we have this bread to set before you,
which earth has given and human hands have made.
It will become for us the bread of life.
Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation:
through your goodness we have this wine to set before you,
fruit of the vine and work of human hands.
It will become for us the cup of salvation.'*

This is a beautiful bringing together of our agricultural context and our mystical, spiritual lives.

In the taking the bread at the communion, we remember Jesus' physical and mystical body, and at the end of the service, we are sent out to be the body of the Body of Christ in the world - in our homes, our workplaces, our schools and our villages.

What happens in our churches every Sunday is the fruit of our week. As the fruits and crops flourish through the summer, so we are called, in Ordinary Time, to continue to 'hear the word and accept it and bear fruit, thirty and sixty and a hundredfold' (Mark 4.20) so that our time in the presence of God can never be just ordinary.

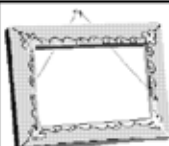

Rainfall report for May/June 2024

May rainfall was 80.7mms (3.17"). We recorded rain on 15 days during the month the wettest being 13th when we had 17.5mms (0.68"). We had two reasonably dry spells from the 7th to the 14th and from the 17th to the 21st.

Temperatures were below average for May/June and one might be forgiven for wondering if summer would ever come? A Cuckoo was heard in Bere Farm wood on 15th May but sadly not by us. We didn't see our first Swift until 26th May. Total rainfall so far for the year is 573mm and to mid-June last year was 440.2mm.

June 2023 to the 15th was 3.1mm (0.12")
June 2024 to the 15th was 14.1mms (0.55")



At our meeting at West Meon Village Hall on Monday 11th June Angie, our President, thanked everyone who had entered the 'Four Scones' competition and congratulated Anne Corden on winning the W.I. Trophy for her excellent entry. She also thanked Anne Fenton and Jan Gavin for the lovely afternoon tea which they had provided for everyone. Angie told us that she had just had a very interesting weekend at Southwick House catering for the families of General Eisenhower, Air Marshall Tedder, and General Montgomery, who were attending the D-Day Celebrations.

Our speaker for the afternoon was Lt. Col. Jeremy Prescott, who has given 528 presentations to 19,000 people on various subjects and his chosen charity is Combat Stress. His very topical subject was "D-Day: The Normandy Landings", which was presented very professionally and set out the details of the campaign very clearly. He commenced by setting out the Allies' four possible choices for the landings ie. Pas de Calais, Brittany, Cherbourg peninsula and Normandy. Plus the leadership had to be selected. Jeremy's presentation was captivating and his accompanying photographs were of a very high quality. I, for one, learnt so much about the D-Day Landings from him.

West Meon Parish Council and Warnford Parish Meeting

West Meon walks booklets. A new stock of the walks booklets detailing popular jaunts around the parish are on sale at the shop for £3 each.

WMPC grants. The Parish Council has an active grants budget for this year. Community groups in the parish can find details of how they can apply for grants on the WMPC website.

Traffic issues within the parish. WMPC asked Hampshire Highways to help address parishioners' concerns about traffic speed and pedestrian safety. We asked for four changes as detailed in the June issue of the Parish News. To date we have only made progress with two matters: Highways will reinstate the lines that mark the virtual pavement in the High Street and have also ordered the replacement flashing 30MPH signs for the A32. WMPC will continue to press for further assistance but are aware of the changed roads policy of Highways and the financial challenges they face.

Police and Crime Commissioner consultation - have your say! A PCC consultation has just opened. This will allow you to inform the PCC on what your priorities are for West Meon. The Parish Council is very keen for as many people as possible to express their concerns over speeding vehicles within the Village, in the hope that this will focus the PCC's attention on speed and enforcement. Road closure through the High Street. As publicised on 'We Are West Meon', the High Street will be closed from near the Thomas Lord to near Meadow House from 22nd July for two weeks. This will affect through travel to East Meon. WMPC will endeavour to post in the shop window, on 'We Are West Meon' and on the parish website further information as it becomes available, including how the closure will affect the 67 bus service.

Hampshire County Council consultation regarding changes to services and amenities. HCC has postponed its announcements following the Spring consultation this year. The results of the consultation will be made known in the Autumn.

Grass and verge cutting. WMPC has refrained from grass cutting and verge strimming during May to support No Mow May and contribute to habitat preservation. However, some cutting and strimming has been started in places where WMPC deems it necessary. This is to aid finding cricket balls at the recreation ground, keeping pavements and footpaths clear and removing nettles where children play. As can be seen at The Cross, WMPC tries to strike a balance between leaving grasses and verges to go wild and ensuring some notion of managing the fast growth during early summer with lots of rain and warmth.

Parking on the recreation ground. For many years, WMPC has informally permitted some parking on a part of the recreation ground adjacent to the village hall in exceptional circumstances or for specific reasons. Following the installation on the new play equipment and the expansion of women and girls football, WMPC will develop a formal policy to provide

clarity regarding such parking.

Warnford Parish Meeting. Information relating to WPM can be found on its website, which also has details of local facilities & services, village news and events etc. Please sign up for Alerts so that you will be informed of forthcoming events etc. The Chair has an email distribution list for parishioners which is used to notify of Parish Meetings (there are two per year, in May and November) and other parish related matters. If you would like to be added to this list, please email the Clerk. The website Alerts system no longer covers local planning applications but, as explained on the website, you can register with South Downs National Park Authority to receive details of these by email.
