The bells, the bells!

Bells have a long history in England and are a core part of Church life, calling us to worship, helping us in our celebrations and sounding in our mourning.

We are blessed in our two parishes to have two peals of bells, with six fine modern bells in Warnford and eight in West Meon.

The peal of bells presently in West Meon were originally six, cast in Whitechapel in London, and were hung in the new church ready for the consecration on 5th May 1846 in an oak frame.

In 1897 two bells were added to the original oak frame, the gift of Richard Earwaker and inscribed on the treble, "The gift of Richard Earwaker, Waker of ears, I speak Earwakers fame, one the gift's office and the giver's name", and on the second bell, "Eu Experrectae clangor meus obstrepit auri qui dedit officium nominat usque meum". West Meon could now boast a peal of eight, and these can be seen in the photo below.

After all this time ringing across the valley, I have to let you know that the bells are in a very poor condition. Two independent experts have recently reported that the wooden frame supporting the bells is no longer safe to support the strain of the bells being rung and needs replacing. In addition, all the bell fixtures and fittings need to be replaced, and the bells

themselves need some remedial work.

There is a longstanding fixture being held to support the efforts to re-hang the bells at nearby Ropley, where a devastating fire destroyed the church and bell tower in 2014. Fundraising to re-hang the bells is still ongoing after nearly 10 years. West Meon will be rung with the other churches in the area in a tower open day in aid of fundraising for Ropley on Sunday 30th September at 17:30 -18:30.

Unfortunately this will be the last time we will hear the bells ring out in West Meon for some time. As we explained at our stall at West Meon Church Fete in June, this will cost approximately £150,000 to reinstate and put the bells in working order.

The Parochial Church Council (PCC) will be meeting in September to consider how this large commitment to raise funds might fit in with other liabilities that are foreseen to maintain the fabric of the church. Unfortunately the church is run on a very tight budget and supported by a small group of donors. We were delighted to hear initial enthusiasm to raise money to repair the bells and would like to invite all those who are interested to join us at St John's Church on the evening of 30th September to hear the bells, to share refreshments and consider ideas for the future.

We are also short of ringers for the bells at West Meon and are always looking for new or returning ringers. Please get in touch if you are interested. *Edwin Grimshaw*



More news from West Meon Village Hall

It has been an active time for the village hall in terms of new initiatives coming to fruition. The Community Cinema ... work is now underway to set up and test the audio and visual equipment we were able to purchase with grant funding. The electronically operated screen which drops down in front of the stage is already up and running and is available for use by any hall hirer. We have a small group of volunteers who are working hard to put in place all the elements involved in running this new exciting venture. We hope to be able to launch in October with our first screening – more details to follow.

We are progressing the installation of WiFi in the hall which will be a much needed resource and we hope will also attract new hirers. The project has proved more complicated than we originally envisaged due to the height of the VH in relation to the nearest pole in Headon View. A new pole , costing just over £1000 was needed next to the hall to take the line. We were very lucky to secure a small grant from WCC which has helped to cover the installation cost. We are now expecting to have WiFi up and running in the very near future.

In our ambitions to reduce running costs and carbon emissions we are in the throws of applying for grants for solar panels, both via Winchester City Council and the National Lottery – more on this next month we hope.

Magical moths

Moths are often described as the dull cousins of colour butterflies, but nothing could be further from the truth. The UK has about 2,500 moth species and their sheer diversity, in terms of their colour, size, form, pattern and intricacy of markings, and their varied and often remarkable

ecology, is nothing short of astonishing. Take the bizarrely named goat moth for

example. Like all moths and butterflies, it has egg, larval and pupal stages. However, amazingly its caterpillar, or larva, overwinters for several years before emerging to spend a comparatively brief couple of months as an adult. Locally, this nationally scarce species is found in the New Forest. But why goat moth? Well, the caterpillars are said to smell of goats!

Interestingly, several of our moths are named

after their caterpillars: the lobster moth and the elephant hawk-moth are good examples. They are reminders of a time before modern light traps made it easier to find the adults and searching out larvae was the main means of recording moths. Not all moths are night flyers. Several species are diurnal and fly mainly during the day. One of the most common day flying moths is the stunning Six-Spot Burnet. These are beautiful insects but are poisonous to anything wanting to eat it. Like butterflies a lot of moths drink the sugary nectar from flowers and feed on sweet tree sap.

Surprisingly for such small insects, some moths migrate here, travelling from Europe or further afield. One migrant that is commonly seen in southern England every year is the Humming-bird hawk moth, coming all the way from the Mediterranean or even north Africa. With numbers peaking in August and September now is the perfect to time to spot this visitor in Hampshire. Unfortunately, like butterflies, moths have suffered a widespread decline. Ultimately this highlights wider environmental damage caused by our impact on the natural world. Moths play vital roles within food chains, being food for birds, bats and mammals and being an important pollinator of plants. Habitat loss, degradation and fragmentation caused

by urbanisation and intensive agriculture are linked closely to the decline. But while we have lost around 40% of our total moths, since 2000 we have gained several dozen new moth species, colonising over from

the continent.

But there is hope! The Reddish buff moth - a rare moth species which is only found on one site in the UK - has recently been recorded for the first time in four years. Two individual moths were found during the Hampshire & Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust's annual moth survey programme, at a sanctuary site on the Isle

of Wight. The last adult moth was found in 2019 and the new find helps raise hopes for the future of this endangered moth. Helen Skelton-Smith

Independent Chapel in Warnford seen from Australia

I visited Warnford and West Meon from the 6th to 8th June in a whistle stop tour to uncover any interesting information about my ancestors...what ended up happening was extraordinary...

In early June, just a couple of months back, I drove through Warnford from Sydney, Australia to investigate the birthplace and residence of my ancestors from the 18th and early 19th century. I


knew that looking for family names like Bignell, Shoveller, Eastman and Aylward from well over two centuries ago was likely to be a wild goose chase. But after finding the 'Church of Our Lady' in Warnford Park, the site of the marriage of my 3 times Greatgrandparents William Shoveller and Mary Bignell in 1789, my spirits lifted.

Young William Shoveller was apprenticed as a 'cutler' in London, and travelled back and forward on the old London Road as his family were residents of Portsmouth, where his father ran a successful ropery and ships chandlery. It was likely while passing through Warnford that he met his bride to be, Mary Bignell. William went on to become a silversmith in Portsea and later purchased a tannery at West Meon. They had two sons and three daughters, the eldest being John Shoveller (b.1789), who began the 'Kings House Academy' boarding school in Portsmouth, and he later gained a Doctoral degree in Law at Oxford. But the death of his mother Mary Shoveller (nee Bignell) in 1825, saw Dr Shoveller and his own family return to the Bignell family residence in Warnford. It was here through his devotion to God that an epiphany presented him with a mission to help the citizens of Warnford and West Meon, by becoming their independent minister.

On the 14th May 1827, just two weeks prior to the birth of his tenth child, he gave a speech at the laying of the first stone for the new Independent Chapels he had established at Warnford & West Meon (Hampshire Telegraph, 14th May 1827, p.4). The commemorative stone bore an appropriate latin inscription from the young gentlemen of his school, and the event was later reported, "A district in the centre of the county of Hants, containing upwards of 300 square miles, was without a dissenting chapel, till about eight years ago, a member of the Church at Portsea used his exertions to erect one at Westmeon, and subsequently another at Warnford. These two places form part of a cluster of villages, in which there is reckoned a population of 5,000 souls, within three or four miles of the chapels. Having been supplied by the students of the Missionary seminary, on their removal from Gosport, the people were on the point

of being left destitute, when John Shoveller L.L.D. from Portsea, fixed his residence among them, and as soon as the church was formed, received a unanimous call to become its pastor; which invitation, after having candidly stated his reasons for supposing that his residence in the neighbourhood might be only temporary, he consented to accept, and on Tuesday, October 6th, he was ordained over the people forming the United Independent Church of Westmeon and Warnford." The Evangelical Magazine and Missionary Chronicle, Vol VII, London, 1829

By then Dr Shoveller had been 15 years married 1812 to Elizabeth Eastman (m.1812), but they sadly lost five of their nine children in squalid Portsmouth before moving to Warnford. Their tenth child however, Thomas Eastman Shoveller was born in Warnford in late May of 1827 and survived to later sail all over the Pacific and emigrate to Australia in 1851, where he eventually settled and married in Grafton, on the north coast of New South Wales. I am his great grandson (through maternal lines)!


Warnford of "Dr Shoveller's chapel" and "Mr. Bignell's field" amongst other items. Regards, Andrew".

So we organised a meeting for the next morning when I was introduced to Stephen Short who benevolently showed me around the village, explaining much... and helping to find the locations that Dr John Shoveller had helped to create. It was remarkable how a chance meeting at the church led to such an extraordinary series of connections, and even more wonderful to have walked in the footsteps of my direct ancestors.

Thank you Warnford and West Meon for being so welcoming and helpful, you are all so very lucky to reside in such a beautiful part of England.

It was after leaving the 'Church of Our Lady' however, that an amazing synchcronicity occurred, when I ran into Andrew Sellick, the owner of Warnford Park. We had a very pleasant chat and I gave him my email in case any information ever came to hand. Then that very same evening I received this email, "Hello Tracy, Since I met you today, we have had the most extraordinary coincidence as we have just obtained an image of a property map from the late 1700s which identifies the location in

Trophy for the best collection of vegetables, the President's Challenge Trophy for the most points awarded in craft classes and finally the Stephens Challenge Trophy for the most points awarded to a member in the show.







We have enjoyed several varied meetings during the summer months including a visit to Warnford Park on a beautiful June evening. Members and their guests started off the event with wine and delicious home-made canapés in the atmospheric setting of the ruins of St. John's House. Our generous host, Andrew Sellick then gave an interesting talk on the history and development of the parkland and its remodelling by "Capability" Brown in the 18th. century. He also showed us how the engineering works to control the flooding of the water meadows and supply to the Bath House had been uncovered.

The speaker at our July meeting was Robert Mocatta who has done a great deal of research on the history of Westbury House which was originally built in the Palladian style but rebuilt in brick after a fire in 1904. He gave us an in depth account of the various families who have been involved with the house over the centuries. Rainfall report for July/August 2023

It is the 15th of August as we write the rainfall report for July/August, the harvest month in the UK and the month when many are having their annual holiday and hoping for some hot and dry weather. The sun is actually shining but that is a rare occurrence so far this month. It has rained on all but 3 days so far in August and the harvest has been slow and spasmodic. Fields of corn which were looking pristine back in June then suffered a battering from the rain in July, all 134mms of it, and then when farmers were looking for a break and some respite to get on with their harvest it got worse! So far in August we have measured 55.8mms(2.19").

'China's Influence on English Ceramics' - A talk by Professor Nigel Wood presenting a fascinating insight into how Chinese export wares helped to drive the development of ceramics.
